Kansas Legislative Report

March 24, 2023

The 2023 Legislative Session has officially reached its halfway point, known as Turnaround. The procedural legislative deadline is significant as it effectively stops bills unless they have passed one chamber or are have touched an exempt committee (budget, tax or federal and state affairs). This week the House and Senate debated and passed dozens of bills that now transition to the opposite chamber to restart the process. Bills subject to the Turnaround deadlines will not be able to receive consideration until next session unless they have been passed by one chamber.

The second half of session, beginning March 1, will see less quantity of bills in play but they will generally have more momentum. March will see the process begin to pick up speed, with two weeks dedicated for committee work and the rest of the month reserved for debating bills and conference committees.

Water Policy and Funding

The last weeks of session continue to see water policy move through the process. The water funding bill saw two days of discussion and eventual approval by the Senate Committee on Agriculture and Natural Resources. Supported by thirty stakeholders, the bill provides historic funding to the state water plan fund. During committee deliberations, the committee voted to change the funding mechanism to a straight \$35M transfer from the state general fund to state water plan fund, for each of the next five years, instead of a designated portion of the existing state sales tax. The revised version of the bill, which includes a handful of other amendments, is now known as Senate Substitute for HB 2302.

Senate Substitute for HB 2302 is now in line for debate on the Senate floor. If passed by the Senate, the two versions of the bill will be negotiated in conference committee.

The Senate Committee on Agriculture and Natural Resources also approved HB 2279, related to ground water management district reporting requirements. Before approval, the committee also adopted a series of amendments, before sending the bill to the Senate floor.

The House Committee on Agriculture and Natural Resources held a hearing on SB 120. Similar to a bill already passed by the House, SB 120 allows the Kansas Department of Health and

Environment to establish rules and regulations for a certification program for certain public water supply systems. The committee approved the bill the following day.

Transportation Policy and Funding

The Senate Committee on Transportation wrapped up business for the session. The committee voted to approve HB 2335, related to the rail service improvement fund. The committee also approved HB 2147, requiring a person providing wrecker or towing service or agency to provide a certification of compliance to a purchaser upon the sale and transfer of an abandoned or towed vehicle.

The House Committee on Transportation already concluded business for the year and did not meet this week.

The House Committee on Tax reviewed several more tax proposals in recent days. After the hearing on SB 248, proposing to eliminate state and local sales tax on food, the committee decided not to consider action to SB 248.

On March 23, the House Committee on Tax approved a comprehensive tax package, contained in House Substitute for SB 169. Among the many provisions is the acceleration of the state sales tax phase-out for food and food ingredients to zero percent as of July 1, 2023. The definition of food and food ingredients used for the exemption remains the same as current law. The committee adjusted the designated percentage of the state sales tax for the state highway fund to 18%, to hold the highway fund harmless. The House is expected to debate the bill next week.
