#### **President's Perspective**

There have been several proud moments in Public Works lately.

Just a few months ago, we celebrated National Public Works Week with an awards ceremony honoring top professionals and projects in Public Works from the KC Metro Chapter. Several of those local award winners will also be honored at the National APWA Conference (PWX), held in Charlotte at the end of August. Congratulations to Tony Hofmann for being named one of the National Top Ten Leaders of the Year and Leslie Donnelly for being named the Myron Calkins Young Leader.



On June 4th, the KC Metro Chapter hosted their annual Membership BBQ Competition at Knights of Columbus Park in Shawnee. There were 13 teams competing in the various BBQ categories, with a wide variety of consulting firms and municipalities represented. Awards were given to the top ranked teams in each of the categories, as well as overall competition winners. Thanks to everyone who made this event possible.

Kansas City will be well represented at PWX this year with national committee members, presenters, exhibitors, and volunteers to support the annual conference. I have had the pleasure of serving on the Small Cities / Rural Communities committee for the past 5 years. Serving on a national committee will provide you with a broader knowledge base and expanded network connections. There are numerous national committees looking for volunteers. With back-to-back disasters in June, the City of Leawood Public Works Department proudly represented Public Works as First Responders. The City of Leawood was one of the primary areas hit with the tornado event that occurred in the early hours of June 8th. Crews were dispatched to assist with the debris removal. After long days of debris removal, Public Works was dispatched on June 10th to assist with another emergency, this one included the rescue of a contractor from a trench collapse. Paul Dunn and Phillip Wilson quickly responded to the call from the Fire Department, arriving onsite with their Vactor truck. After two hours, they were able to successfully remove the 66-year old man from the trench. A few days later, Paul and Phillip continued their dedicated service to the community by working extra hours at the resident drop-off event that following weekend. That is true dedication!

The KC Metro Chapter APWA Executive Committee presented Paul and Phillip with a Certificate of Recognition at the Leawood City Council meeting, with their families present. There is not enough recognition of Public Works' role as a First Responder. Public Works employees are the first to arrive on the scene to clear the roadways for first responders, the last to leave to remove the last of the debris to make the roadways safe for the community, and the hardest workers during the event serving as a useful resource. If you know of a Public Works Hero that should be recognized for their contribution, forward information to the Executive Board.



# POLICY FOR THE USE OF THE APWA PUB NEWS, WEBSITE AND ELECTRONIC MAILING LIST

It shall be the policy of the KC Metro Chapter that the use of the "APWA Pub News, Website and Electronic Mailing List" by outside agencies shall abide by the following:

- Outside agencies, educational institutions, and notfor-profit organizations may utilize the Chapter's website for dissemination of approved items that are considered beneficial to our membership.
- Approval of these items may be granted by the Chapter President, the Newsletter Editor and the Website Committee. When requested, announcements from other organizations may be posted on the Chapter's website under "News" if the Newsletter/Communications Committee is provided electronic announcements in a format that can be posted without modification or editing.
- The Newsletter/Communications Committee may use the chapter's electronic mailing list for announcements to KC Metro Chapter members when the topic is related to an APWA activity or event. However, an announcement will not be sent before the Chapter event has been posted on the KC Metro Chapter website.

This policy was approved by the Executive Committee on November 19, 2008.
