



Benchmarking Data Collection



In 2017, the Leadership and Management Committee launched the benchmarking project to address two goals of the Strategic Plan: Value and Voice. The committee determined that public works leaders' primary needs were benchmarks and service standards for determining appropriate funding and staffing levels for their departments. Powered by data submitted by agencies just like yours, these benchmarks capture our responsibilities and resources. Coupled with agency classifications like size, region, and weather, the benchmarks let you compare what other similarly-situated agencies are doing, so you are prepared with data and evidence to support your resource requirements.

Goal: To develop a benchmarking tool for agencies to easily access and find data from comparable communities on public works resources (e.g., budget, staffing, services, etc.).

Why: To better tell our public works story using benchmarking data. Our brother and sister first responders in police and fire rescue departments use national or international data to determine and justify service levels within their respective departments. This is an effective approach that helps them obtain the funding needed to perform their jobs of keeping our communities safe. We have seen this similar information request from elected officials and the public for public works services, so data collected will allow public works professionals to determine and justify service levels similarly.

* All agencies that complete the questionnaire will be given a complimentary PDF report.

What: A benchmarking database to fill the current gaps in the information available for public works services.

Questionnaire Suggestions –

To help the process be more efficient, agencies are strongly encouraged to print out the questions, so they have time to gather the information required. The time required for this first step will vary between agencies as it will depend on the accessibility and knowledge of the required information. Additionally, this step may need information from others within the agency, which may also take time to collect.

The questionnaire is divided into six sections (general, fleet, transportation and utilities, stormwater and facilities, solid waste, and winter maintenance). Each section can be sent directly to individuals in your agency responsible for those areas for data collection.

Public Works Institute: Public Works Management — October 18-20, 2022

The Kansas City Metro Chapter held its 19th Public Works Institute (PWI) session entitled Public Works Management Fundamentals October 18-20 at the Independence Uptown Farmers Market, Independence, MO. Thanks to Lisa Reynolds, Independence Municipal Services Director and other Independence staff for making this facility available at no charge to the chapter. This allowed us to keep the registration fee at \$250 again for this session.

The class was welcomed to the PWI training on the first morning by Chapter President Alysen Abel and to Independence by Zach Walker, City Manager of Independence.

Seventy-six individuals attended the three-day training and presentations by many of the region's public works directors and senior public works staff. This attendance brought us to a total of 408 public works professionals who have attended at least one three-day PWI since the chapter began the program in 2011. Through 2021, the chapter had graduated 188 professionals from our PWI (which requires attending all four of the three-day training modules). Eight more persons (shown in the photo below) completed the requirements for graduation in this latest PWI and will be recognized as 2022 graduates along with six others that completed it in April 2022.





POLICY FOR THE USE OF THE APWA PUB NEWS, WEBSITE AND ELECTRONIC MAILING LIST

It shall be the policy of the KC Metro Chapter that the use of the "APWA Pub News, Website and Electronic Mailing List" by outside agencies shall abide by the following:

- Outside agencies, educational institutions, and notfor-profit organizations may utilize the Chapter's website for dissemination of approved items that are considered beneficial to our membership.
- Approval of these items may be granted by the Chapter President, the Newsletter Editor and the Website Committee. When requested, announcements from other organizations may be posted on the Chapter's website under "News" if the Newsletter/Communications Committee is provided electronic announcements in a format that can be posted without modification or editing.
- The Newsletter/Communications Committee may use the chapter's electronic mailing list for announcements to KC Metro Chapter members when the topic is related to an APWA activity or event. However, an announcement will not be sent before the Chapter event has been posted on the KC Metro Chapter website.

This policy was approved by the Executive Committee on November 19, 2008.
