TECHNO MINUTE FROM MIKE ROSS


I'm involved in Overland Park's chip seal program as the defacto materials engineer. One of the important characteristics of the chips used in chip seals is their flakiness. Flakiness is very similar to the "flat and elongated" measurement used in asphalt, but it's not the same and it requires the use of a slotted gage that isn't readily available. Humboldt sells a flakiness gage, but the test we were wanting to use specified slot widths that were slightly different than the Humboldt model - and those differences were most pronounced for the two slots we would be using for our aggregate sizes. We were unwilling to specify a characteristic that we couldn't accurately measure.



Having exhausted my Googling skills in finding the exact gage I wanted, I turned next to searching for metal fabricators. The gage needed to be made from sheet steel, and it needed to be fairly precisely fabricated. I

found several "part fabricators" and on a lark, emailed Quickparts a drawing of the gage asking for a quotation. They replied that day and asked for a 3-D CAD drawing of the "part." I had Joe Archer, one of our engineering technicians prepare the 3D drawing in AutoCAD and attached it to my response email. Quickparts returned a guote, discounted if I purchased 5 units to \$60.00 per unit. This entire exchange happened over the course of two days. Humboldt wanted \$55.00 for a very similar gage, so the \$60 seemed reasonable. I placed an order using a city credit card.

FIGURE 1 - SLOTTED SIEVE OPENINGS.




Less than two weeks later. FedEx delivered 5 gages to me in a heavy cardboard envelope. I was very impressed with the quality of the machining. The machined edges were crisp with no burrs, and a careful examination with a digital caliper showed that each of the slots measured within one or two thousandths for the entire length of the slot. Most measurements were to the thousandths of inch as specified. From the package, it was apparent that the fabricator was located somewhere in China. QuickParts appears to be a US company, and they offer a fairly wide range of fabrication services including several 3D plotting options. My plates were obviously manufactured using subtractive techniques and not 3D plotted.

My mail order experience used to be that whatever was ordered took several weeks to arrive and these were pre -manufactured products. In this case, I was able to specify a design, the material I wanted used (highcarbon plate steel), and I was provided a very accurately and nicely machined part within several weeks from halfway around the world. Had I been thinking. I would have added embossed or engraved lettering. If we wear these gages out, I'll do so with revision 2.0.

If you need a custom part, and can provide a 3D drawing – there are lots of places that can provide this service - alternatively, and especially for plastic parts you can purchase a 3D plotter (or go to the library) and make your own. Updates to the APWA Erosion and Sediment Control Standard Drawings

The Erosion and Sediment Control (ESC) sub-committee to the Water Resources committee is proposing revisions to the current erosion and sediment control standard drawings. The original erosion and sediment control specifications, design criteria, and standard drawings were created in the early 2000's. While the specifications and design criteria were last updated in 2008 and 2010, respectively, the standard drawings have not been updated since their original development. Subsequent to the development of the current erosion and sediment control standard drawings, the industry shifted its focus to erosion control BMPs (before erosion occurs) as the primary line of defense, with sediment control BMPs (after erosion occurs) as a secondary line of defense. A significant change in the standard drawings will be required in order to align with the current focus of the industry. This document serves to gain consensus on what the industry standard of practice is for erosion and sediment control in the Kansas City Metro region before spending the resources to make updates.

Please take some time to review the consensus document and provide comments. The 30-day comment period ends May 29th. The consensus document can be found at <u>http://kcmetro.apwa.net/MenuHomepage/99/Specifications</u>.
