DELEGATE DETAILS

FROM JOE JOHNSON

We are quickly coming to the end of 2014 and it seems like each year goes by faster than the previous. This year we have seen a complete change in the House of Delegates. Not only has the name changed to the Council of Chapters, but also how this group functions. Chapters are working on their By-Laws to incorporate the new name and ours should be ready to vote on by the Holiday Party.

There are several committees within the Council of Chapters. Each Delegate participates on one of the committees addressing issues affecting our Chapter. This past Congress was the first meeting of the Council of Chapters and we will meet again February 26 in Kansas City during the Leadership Training. During this meeting we will get updates on the progress these committees are making with each of their assignments. Once a committee completes it assignment the information goes to National Staff and the Board and then out to the Chapters.



At the National Level membership is holding at 28,651. Our overall member retention is at 86.47% which is consistent with last month. This year's average retention is about 1.4% lower than the prior fiscal year's. The 2014 "1st Time Member" special offer campaign brought in 1,751 new members; 192 of those are in Canada. That is about 21% (298 members) higher than same-time-last-year. The Chapters current membership is 777 up from 770 in June.

The "APWA Membership: What Can It Do for You?" PowerPoint presentation has been updated. It is available in the Members Only part of www.apwa.net, - go to Member Tools, then click on "Retention Toolkit". This presentation was originally designed as a tool for reminding members of all the programs and opportunities APWA provides, but it can also be utilized as a recruitment tool. A script is provided with the presentation. There's also a continuous loop version of the presentation which does not require a presenter, so it can be running in the background or on a side table at a display booth.

The 2015 Chapter Leadership Training is set for February 26-27 in Kansas City. The biennial event brings together leaders from most APWA Chapters. This provides the opportunity for chapters and branch leaders to network and exchange ideas with other leaders while learning more about the resources available to leaders from National.

It's not too early to think about the 2015 Snow Conference and the International Public Works Congress & Exposition. The North American Snow Conference will be held April 12-15, 2015 in Grand Rapids, MI. This unique event offers the public works/winter maintenance community the opportunity to experience the most concentrated collection of snow and ice solutions under one roof. The 2015 APWA International Public Works Congress & Exposition will be in Phoenix, AZ. August 30-September 2.

2014 is quickly fading into the past and 2015 will soon be upon us. It continues to be a pleasure representing the Chapter as your Delegate and I am looking forward to another year. As always if you have any questions about what is happening at the national level please let me know.

TECHNO MINUTE

FROM MIKE ROSS

Tim Ross just presided over the annual Chapter Planning Retreat at Westwood City Hall. The Chapter has held these for decades - they give the new leadership group a running start for the new year. Among many other topics, we discussed the use of the website at the retreat, and encouraged all committee chairs to make full use of the website to conduct their committees business. The website provides a central location for storing documents, for managing activities, and for archiving history. We've been fortunate over the past 18 years to win the President's Award for Chapter Excellence (PACE). The application process for the PACE award benefits from our ability to document our many activities. The website makes the task of storing that record relatively easy and it provides a mechanism for retrieving that information open to all of our chapter leaders.



The website has undergone a number of changes in recent years. The KCMetro chapter migrated to the new chapter template website (CT4) late in 2013, and used it to manage the MidAm show and chapter events for this year.

If you were frustrated by the performance of the website earlier this year you should give it another try – it's much, much faster and many bugs have been discovered and fixed. APWA continues to make improvements and have listed "Constantly improve and enhance website and tools for chapters" as a secondary priority of the National 2014-2017 Strategic Plan.


To add or edit any content, you must be an administrator and you must be logged in. To log in you must have a username and a password. If you've forgotten yours, the KCMetro site has links that will allow you to reset your password. If you've forgotten your username and you're a member, you can call APWA National at (816) 572-6100 for assistance – or you can use the Login Recovery system at Nationals website http://www.apwa.net/Account/RecoverUserPassword/. This does require you to know your member number – but the page gives instructions on where to find that information if you've lost you membership card. The credentials used for accessing the chapter website and the national website are the same, so if you've created an account on one, you can use it on the other.

All content editing/creation starts at the Control Panel:



After you've logged in, and if you've been given any administrative rights, you should have a "Control Panel" link at the upper right of the KCMetro webpage.

The document library provides a mechanism for organizing committee and chapter documents. In its current state, it does not allow you to preview files, and the "Delete" link does not delete any files. Solutions to these issues are on National's list of enhancements, but even in its current form this is a useful tool. This tool makes it easy to create folders and to upload files into those folders. Other creation tools have links that allow the user to connect to files stored in the document library. This screenshot shows the files stored in the folder Comm-Comm&Pub – the Communications and Publicity Committees folder.




While we're waiting for the addition of a file previewer and other enhancements that would make the document library behave more like Windows Explorer, we can use an FTP site that National configured for us. This site is documented on the chapter website (under Resources). The FTP site is updated periodically, so files that you upload today may not appear until tomorrow on the FTP site. This is open to members, so committee chairs might want to distribute documents to the committee members through the FTP connection. The page provides a link to the free FTP program FileZilla. If you can download this program, I'd recommend that you do so – it will make your FTP experience much more friendly.

Administrators can create and edit new content pages (From Control Panel – Page Manager – Create New Page). We've got many "great" minds in our chapter, and because they often think alike, please conduct a search for your content page prior to creating a new one – use the search box and any part of a page title to search for content.

The content page editor is a "what you see is what you get" (WYSIWYG) style editor. By clicking on the "Image" tool you can add hyperlinks to documents stored in the document library to your page. Here's the content page editing toolbar with the image tool that does this circled in red:



After clicking the image tool, the Insert/edit image dialog opens:



If you then click the "Browse" link, the document library will open from which you can select a file to insert into the content page. Sounds like a lot of steps, but once you do it a few times it's really very easy.

The Specifications Page is an example of a content page constructed using these tools. Note that because we are currently unable to delete files we also are unable to replace older files with newer ones. The workaround is to add dates or serial numbers to the filename. Hopefully National will add this capability in the near future. They aren't charging us for storage, so aside from the digital clutter, we can't complain.

APWA is constantly improving and updating the code behind the website. If you encounter problems with the website, you might try another Internet browser. I use Google Chrome, but find that Microsoft Internet Explorer works better. If you find problems and report them to me, I'll forward them on to National. I was sending Ashley Wilson a lot of emails during the period leading up to the MidAm, and she always responded very quickly often with a resolution to the problem we were encountering. A documented list of steps to reliably cause the problem is extremely helpful to the developers assigned the task of fixing the problem.



KC Metro Chapter Myron D. Calkins Scholarship



Each Spring, the Kansas City Metro Chapter solicits applications for the Myron D. Calkins scholarship. This three part series, leading up to the 2015 call for applications, will highlight the history of Myron Calkins and the scholarship, provide information on eligibility and purpose of the scholarship, and finally conclude with application details.

Part 1: Scholarship History

The KC Metro chapter established the Myron D. Calkins Scholarship fund in 1985 in recognition of the extraordinary service of Mr. Calkins to the Chapter and the Association and most importantly his impact on the careers of public works professionals across the Kansas City Metro area.

Who was Myron D. Calkins, and why recognize him with a scholarship?

Myron was born in Tacoma, Washington in 1919. In interviews conducted with Myron, he admitted to being a poor student throughout high school. He went to college at Washington State primarily following in his father's footsteps because he didn't know what else to do. After his freshman year, he took a break and worked in farming.


Realizing that farm work wasn't for him, he got a job as a rod man on a survey crew. This is where he learned what civil engineering was about and, armed with a better idea of what he wanted to do, he returned to Washington State. With a new focus, Myron graduated with honors from Washington State University with a degree in Civil Engineering.

After spending some time with the US Geological Survey and the US Navy he began his career in public works. Myron worked for the City of Tacoma as a civil engineer for sixteen years before moving to Kansas City where he served as the Director of Public Works for the City of Kansas City, Missouri from 1964 until 1986. During this time he had a hand in many prominent projects including the construction of the Kansas City International Airport, Bartle Hall Convention Center and Kemper Arena. For his work in public works, Myron was recognized as a 'Top Ten Public Works Leader of the Year' by APWA.

Myron Calkins' influence extended well beyond his duties as Director of Public Works. In 1955, prior to coming to Kansas City, Myron joined APWA and quickly got involved with the Washington State Chapter eventually serving as Chapter President. When he moved to Kansas City, he began to work with two other local engineers to develop a local affiliate organization of APWA encompassing the KC Metro area. In 1965 the KC Metro chapter separated from the Missouri and Kansas Chapters. Myron served as President of the KC Metro chapter and later served APWA regionally and then nationally as a national officer and president.

Why did the Chapter establish a scholarship recognizing Myron Calkins? Because Myron holds a special place in the history of the KC Metro Chapter and in the public works profession. As Myron was nearing retirement co-workers and friends wanted to honor him and as a result decided to establish a scholarship in his name. Myron was a mentor and leader to many who have served in public works throughout the Kansas City metro. The scholarship fund is a fitting tribute to the life and career of one man who profoundly influenced the practice of Public Works in the Kansas City metro area and nationally.

ARTICLE XIII - ELECTION OF OFFICERS

SECTION 1. The President shall appoint a Nominating Committee of the three most recent past presidents having current membership in the Chapter. The most recent Past President who is available shall serve as Chair of the Nominating Committee. If a past President is unable to serve as Chair or member of the Nominating Committee, then the President should appoint a past member of the Executive Committee as Chair or member of the Nominating Committee. The Nominating Committee shall report the names of its nominees for each office standing election to the Executive Committee by October 1. The names of the nominees shall be made available to all voting members a minimum of 15 days prior to the election or distribution of ballots in order for self nominations to be declared. One or more nominations shall be made by the Nominating Committee for each office. No persons serving on the Nominating Committee shall be eligible for nomination except by written declaration presented to the Nominating Committee.

SECTION 2. The Executive Committee shall prescribe the form of ballot, schedule and other details of the election procedure. The annual election shall be held at a time and place determined by the Executive Committee. Additional nominations for any office shall be made in writing, officially signed by not less than five Chapter members and shall be filed with the Secretary not less than one week prior to the annual meeting.

SECTION 3. Newly elected Officers and Directors shall assume office at the beginning of the administrative year with the Vice President elected the previous year becoming President.

SECTION 4. In the event of extraordinary and extenuating circumstances, the Executive Committee shall have the power to declare the term of office of any or all Chapter Officers and Directors extended for one full term.

APWA Construction Specifications Updates

Wilson & Company Updates APWA Construction Specifications

The KC Metro Chapter Standard Specifications have been used for many years by communities for construction projects in the metropolitan area. The intent of having these common standards is to promote consistency across the metro area and allowing more efficient bidding which can result in cost savings to the communities. The standards also assist communities to comply with current federal regulations. A common standard can also benefit all communities by sharing the knowledge and experience of multiple communities through the development of the standards. However, most sections of the current documents have not been updated for many years to reflect current practices, materials and regulations, thus diminishing the value of the common standards.

This questionnaire is seeking comments from a wide variety of sources for possible revisions of the existing documents.

- Update of the technical specifications, Sections 2000-2900, along with the General Conditions, Section 1100, and construction related Standard Details for obvious updates, inaccuracies, etc.
- Identify items that need to be updated to correctly reference or comply with current state and/or federal regulations as well as other standards such as current ASTM, AASHTO, MoDOT, and KDOT.
- Review a variety of standards documents used by metro cities that use modified APWA documents or totally separate standards and identify differences and commonalities with APWA.
- Prepare a list of deficiencies or needed updates and make recommendations on what revisions should be made, including sections to be added or deleted if appropriate. The list will include possible new products, materials, or methods that may need to be added to the documents.
