MEMBERSHIP

As some of you may have heard at PWX, National Membership is over 30,300, the highest it has ever been. With that retention in membership is over 90%. The Chapter's membership is at 779 up from 761 a year ago.

GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS

The House is in recess for the month of August and will return to Washington, D.C., on September 4, 2018. The Senate will be in session most of August with only a very abbreviated recess August 6-10, 2018. The Senate will be focusing its legislative efforts on fiscal year (FY) 2019 appropriations, judicial nominations, and reauthorization of the Federal Aviation Administration, among other items. The current fiscal year expires September 30, 2018. To date, no FY 2019 appropriations bills have been passed by Congress and sent to President Trump to sign into law. The need for a continuing resolution is highly likely to keep the federal government funded and fully operating when FY 2019 begins on October 1, 2018. To stay apprised of what is happening on Capitol Hill, be sure to check out *Advocacy News* at www.apwa.net, follow APWA Government Affairs on Twitter @APWAGOVAFFAIRS, and read the *APWA Washington Report*.

APWA Board member Kathleen Davis, and APWA Government Affairs Director Andrea Eales met with the Federal Highway Administration's (FHWA) Acting Administrator Brandye Hendrickson in Washington, D.C., August 1. APWA Executive Director Scott Grayson and Andrea Eales previously met with Acting Administrator Hendrickson in May where discussion focused on the Every Day Counts initiative and the multiple initiatives APWA and FHWA work on together to include participation in the Executive Leadership Group for Transportation Incident Management, the Road to Zero coalition, and the Local Technical Assistance Program.

As always, Bill and I are here to communicate with National and our Chapter any concerns or issues that you have may regarding APWA. Please let us know if I can assist you.
