Kansas Legislative Report

February 23, 2024

The 2024 Legislative Session has officially reached its halfway point, known as Turnaround. The procedural legislative deadline is significant as it effectively stops legislative bills unless they have passed one chamber or have touched an exempt committee (budget, tax or federal and state affairs). This week the House and Senate debated and passed dozens of bills that now transition to the opposite chamber to restart the process. Bills subject to the Turnaround deadlines will not be able to receive consideration after February 23 unless they have been passed by one chamber.

The second half of session, beginning next week, will see less quantity of bills floating around but remaining bills generally have more momentum. March will see the process begin to pick up speed, with two weeks dedicated for committee work and the rest of the month reserved for debating bills and conference committees.

The development of the budget bills will occupy considerable time, along with consideration of tax policy. After a tax debate on the House floor, Governor Kelly's January veto of the comprehensive tax package (HB 2284 conference committee report) stands. It is unclear if another package will be put together.

Water Policy & Funding

This week, the House Committee on Water held a hearing on HB 2695, a bill allowing a majority of eligible voters in a groundwater management district or an area for a proposed extension or reduction of a district to petition the chief engineer to extend or reduce the territory in a groundwater management district. The bill saw opposition from all five groundwater management districts, as well as the Kansas Farm Bureau. The Kansas Department of Agriculture testified as neutral. However, since the bill was not passed by the House before Turnaround, HB 2695 was not advanced, the bill is

effectively dead. Additionally, the House Committee on Appropriations received a budget report on the Kansas Water Office.

The house debated and passed multiple water bills this week. HB 2634, a bill providing an additional corrective control provision for the chief engineer to consider when issuing orders of designations for local enhanced management areas and intensive groundwater use control areas, passed unanimously.

HB 2633 provides for additional sources of revenue for the water program management fund and requires water supply system and wastewater treatment facility operator certification examination fees to not exceed the costs for such exams. HB 2678 extends the period for how long a groundwater right can be deposited in a water bank and requires a water bank to authorize a withdrawal of water on or before December 1 of the calendar year in which the withdrawn water is to be used. Both bills passed the house 119-1.

HB 2587 also passed the house 116-4. This is a bill authorizing the board of directors for a drainage district to hold a meeting in executive session in accordance with the Open Meetings Act.

HB 2525 passed the house 87-24 earlier in the session and is awaiting a hearing in the Senate Committee on Agriculture and Natural Resources. This is a bill providing for additional sources of revenue for the water program management fund and creating additional fees for the regulation of underground injection control wells.

Next week on February 29, the Senate Committee on Local Government will have a hearing on SB 510. SB 510 specifies that any city that has previously provided sewer service to a property that was disconnected from the system would be required to reconnect the property to the sewer system within ten days of a request by the property owner. There would be no cost to the property owner if the disconnection was not from a failure to pay sewer fees.

Another new bill of interest is SB 524, a bill specifying when boards of directors for irrigation districts of 35,000 or more acres may conduct board member elections by mail ballot and establishing the terms for such members. The bill was introduced in the Senate Committee on Ways & Means and has no hearing date scheduled.

Bills that did not pass out of committee and effectively expired due to Turnaround deadlines include:

- SB 383 Authorizing the board of directors for a drainage district to hold a meeting in executive session in accordance with the Open Meetings Act. The house version has passed.
- HB 2372 Regulating the land application of swine manure and wastewater.

- HB 2486 Removing the definition of lead-free and an exception for lead joints in the public water supply system law and updating terminology relating to hazardous waste generated by certain persons.
- HB 2695 Allowing a majority of eligible voters in a groundwater management district or an area for a proposed extension or reduction of a district to petition the chief engineer to extend or reduce the territory in a groundwater management district.
- HB 2696 Allowing a groundwater management district the opportunity to provide a written comment rather than a recommendation to the chief engineer for a proposed water conservation area and management plan.
- HB 2697 Allowing groundwater management district boards to provide relevant information rather than advice and assistance regarding groundwater management and other appropriate matters of concern of a district.

Exempt bills not advanced but still alive include:

- HB 2459 Prohibiting the change of the point of diversion of a water right if such change causes the safe yield of the source of water supply to be exceeded.
- HB2526 Authorizing the chief engineer to adopt rules and regulations concerning fees and inspections of dams.

Transportation Policy & Funding

The Senate debated and passed SB 272 by a 36-4 vote. Proposed by the Kansas Association of Airports, SB 272 aims to increase the annual Kansas Department of Transportation intra-agency transfer from the State Highway Fund to the Kansas Airport Improvement Program from \$5M to \$15M. The bill now heads to the House.

The Northern Flyer Alliance's SB 349, establishing an intercity passenger rail service program and making annual transfers into the Passenger Rail Service Revolving Fund, now resides in the House Committee on Transportation.

Next week both transportation committees will receive recently passed legislation from the opposite chamber and may plan for hearings next month.

Several transportation bills tracked have stalled due to Turnaround deadlines. These include:

- SB 90/HB 2418- bills to eliminate the \$4 Division of Vehicles Modernization Surcharge collected at the time of vehicle registration. This would reduce the State Highway Fund by over \$6M.
- SB 402- prohibiting crew size requirements for class II and class III railroads.
- HB 2004- establishing the EV energy equity road repair tax act.

• HB 2631- directing the Kansas turnpike authority to establish a toll exemption program for current members of the armed forces.

Several other transportation bills remain alive because they were introduced in exempt committees though they have not been formally considered.
